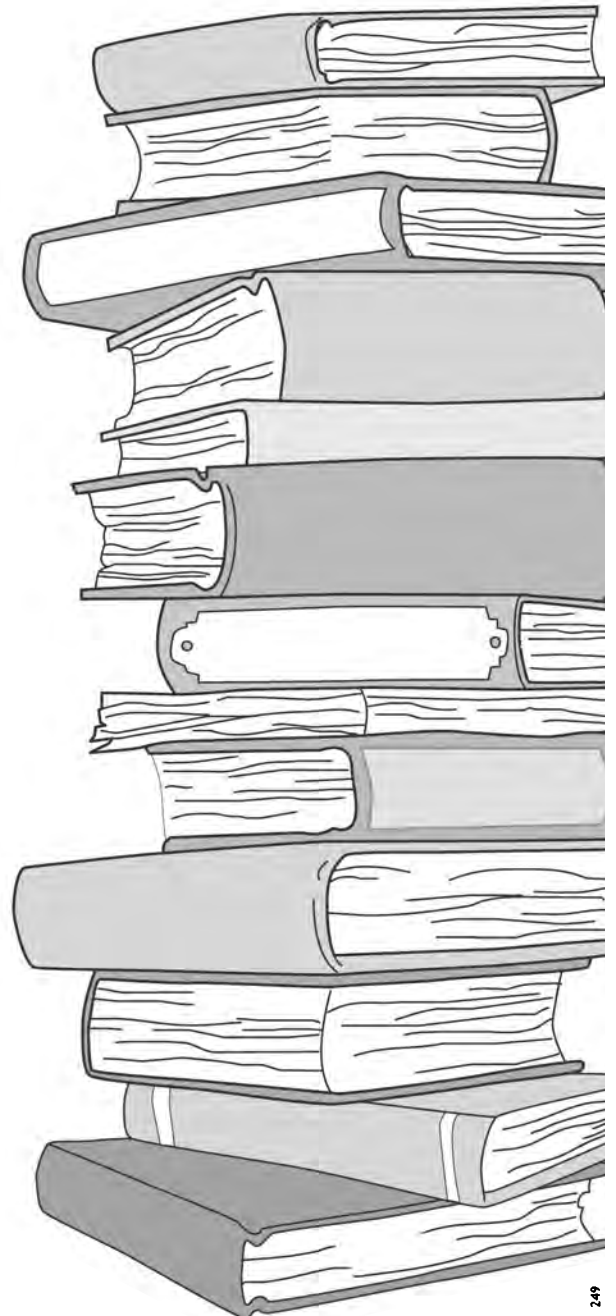
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Introduction

This book is designed to provide practice in a variety of activities aimed at strengthening students' perceptual skills.

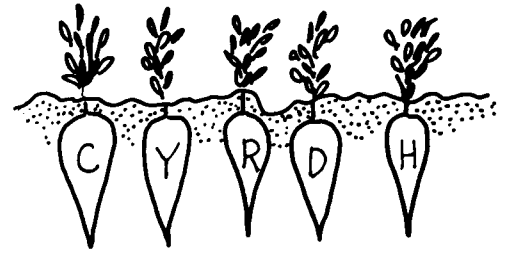
